After coming down nicely for several weeks, eggs jumped 3 cents or more the last few days. Eggs that sold in Omaha for 25 cents a dozen not many days ago are now selling for 28. The big snow storms throughout the east are blamed for the rise. A great demand has been created there for the eggs from this section, and the result is that the price has been boosted here. The eastern hen during the snow storms is not supplying the eastern consumer with eggs. It is a well known fact that hens will not lay in very cold weather, especially during a period of snow storms. It is expected that in a few weeks when the inclement weather of the east shall have passed over, eggs will again come down several cents a dozen.

Cheese has gone up 11/2 cents a pound in the last few days, and no definite cause is assigned. It jumped from I cent to 11/2 cents, wholesale, since last Monday. New Cabbage Here.

New cabbage has arrived from Texas. It is of good solid quality and is selling at 21/2 cents a pound. Cabbage has for some reason been held down to 21/4 and 3 cents practically all the winter, and now that new cabbage has arrived on the market before the supply of old is exhausted. it is expected that the price will remain reasonable, especially if the new crop proves a good one. The new cabbage is in large heads, instead of the small grade that was marketed when the supply of old cabbage was growing short.

Old potatoes are still selling at \$1 a market. New ones are so high as to be almost prohibitive to most families.
