MISSOURI VALLEY GETS RAIN

Precipitation is Heavy and Extends Over Large Area-

GREAT FOR THE SPRING CROPS

Moisture Sonks Into the Ground and Will Go a Long Way Toward Staving Off Any Possible Dry Spell.

While Omaha was being given a thorough drenching Thursday night, the whole of Nebraska, western Iowa, the southern portion of South Dakota, Kansas, Colorado and Wyoming got the same kind of treatment. According to the reports to the railroads it was the heaviest and most general rain of the season. It is declared that it will be of inestimable value to the growing crop and will preclude the possibility of a drouth during the early portion of the growing period. at least.

Station reports to the railroads indicate that in many localities a light fall of hail accompanied the rain and some wind, but not enough to do, any large amount of damage. Throughout the western portion of the state the rain comenced early in the afternoon and continued well into the night and without any cessation. Up the Elkhorn valley and out in the South Platte country, it started in the early evening and for from four to six hours there was a steady downpour, coming down gently and all soaking into the ground

Prom more than 100 stations in branka the Burlington, Union Pacific, Northwestern, Missouri Pacific and Rock Island report from three-fourths to an inch of rain during Thursday afternoon and night. At no place did the rain reach flood proportions and it came so gently and continued over such a long period that there was no damage.

Trainmen in from the west asserted that all the way from Wyoming to Omaha it rained a greater portion of the night and that the water standing on the ground indicated that the soil had been scaked to a depth of several inches at least.

Along the Missouri river valley and over in lows the precipitation was a little heavier than out in the state. In Omaha the rainfall was slightly in excash of one and one-fourth inches and about the same down as far as Nebranka City and up the river to Te-

Railroad reports are to the effect that out in the state it is clear and the temperature rising rapidly,


