

The building will be thirtyfour meters long by thirty-three meters wide.

In addition to the exhibits in the Cuban pavilion, Cuba will exhibit extensively in several of the main exposition palaces. Especially noteworthy will be the sanitary exhibit in the Palace of Social Economy and Education, which will display the methods of fighting tropical diseases which made possible American construction of the Panama canal. It was in Cuba that the first battles with yellow fever and the other scourges of the tropics were first successfully waged. The achievements there were utilized in making sanitary the cansi zone.
