



### Local Tourists Are Buying Travelers' Checks in Numbers

The season of travel is already arriving and travelers' checks are again in demand. Already the express companies and banks are selling a considerable quantity of these. So popular have these travelers' checks become that few people now travel with large sums of money on their person, since they have found that the travelers' checks are every bit as convenient and that the loss of the traveler's checks uninsured is no loss at all to the loser.

These checks are issued in convenient denominations of \$10, \$20, \$50, \$100 and \$200. The cost of obtaining these is but 50 cents per \$100 worth. The traveler simply goes to the express office or the bank where these checks are sold and buys them in any quantity and in any denominations he desires. He is required to sign his name at the top of the check when he obtains it. That simply shows it has been issued to him. He cannot cash it until he signs it properly at the bottom. The signature is compared with the signature at the top. If he loses any of the checks the finder can scarcely forge his signature in such a way as not to have the difference detected and be caught.

One remarkable case is of an Omaha man who bought travelers' checks from an express company to the amount of \$1,400 when he was starting for a trip to Germany. When he arrived at New York he had lost the bundle of checks. He was frantic. He rushed to the New York office of the company, and told his troubles. He felt sure that he had lost \$1,400. If he had carried that much in bills it would have been lost. But the New York office paid him his \$1,400 in thirty minutes after he proved his identity. A few days later the checks appeared. They had been found in the Pullman car in which the man had slept on the way to New York.
