

ROURKES TAKE HIGH FLIGHT

Tipple Starts Like Artist and Fans 'Em All One Round.

ASCEND IN SEVENTH INNING

Foam Goes to Pieces Behind Stevens in Eighth and Final Count is Eleven to Two for the Wichtas.

WICHITA, Kan., June 10.—(Special Telegram)—After pitching no-hit ball the first time through the Jobbers' batting order, Tipple weakened. The second trip to the plate by the Jobbers broke the ice in three places, and in the seventh inning they all took a trip to the plate, scoring four runs on four hits. Stevens was not hit hard in the eighth, but the team went to pieces behind him and four errors, added to the three hits made, allowed five runs to score. The final count was 11 to 2 for Wichita.

Nick Maddox pitched a strong game all the way through. He practically pitched a no-hit game for six innings. One scratch hit was collected in the second inning. Thomason got the first clean hit, a double to center in the seventh after one was down. Krug grounded out to first and Thomason scored when Ward's hit to third took a bad bound. Doubles by Crosby and Shestak, who batted for Tipple, scored the other run in the eighth.

Tipple started like a winner. The Jobbers were moved down in one, two, three order for three innings. Two singles and a walk filled the bases after two were down in the fourth, and Bills flew to Schlipke for the third out.

In the fifth, after two were down, Maddox got a Texas leaguer to left that Krug couldn't get under. Ocha doubled, scoring Maddox from first. Nicholson singled, counting Ocha. Nicholson stole second, but O'Rourke hit to Krug.

Ocha tripped to center, counting two runs. Nicholson singled, adding one more. O'Rourke and Henry singled, filling the bases, and Graham walked, sending one more run in. Bills hit a liner over first, that was tugged for a cleanup, but Chase jumped in the air and squeezed the ball for an unassisted double.

The Rourkes went to pieces in the eighth. Doubles by Bosonoli and Fitzsimmons in succession started the trouble and two boots by Thomas and a dropped fly by Krug and an error by Chase, who was caught by surprise on a throw from Stevens to catch a runner, added to the rout of the Goding men. Thomason also dropped a fly in this session, but he forced a runner at third and saved himself an error.

Jimmy Durham and Willis are the probable pitchers for tomorrow. Conzation, who has been recovering from a strained muscle in his side, probably will get back in the game tomorrow.

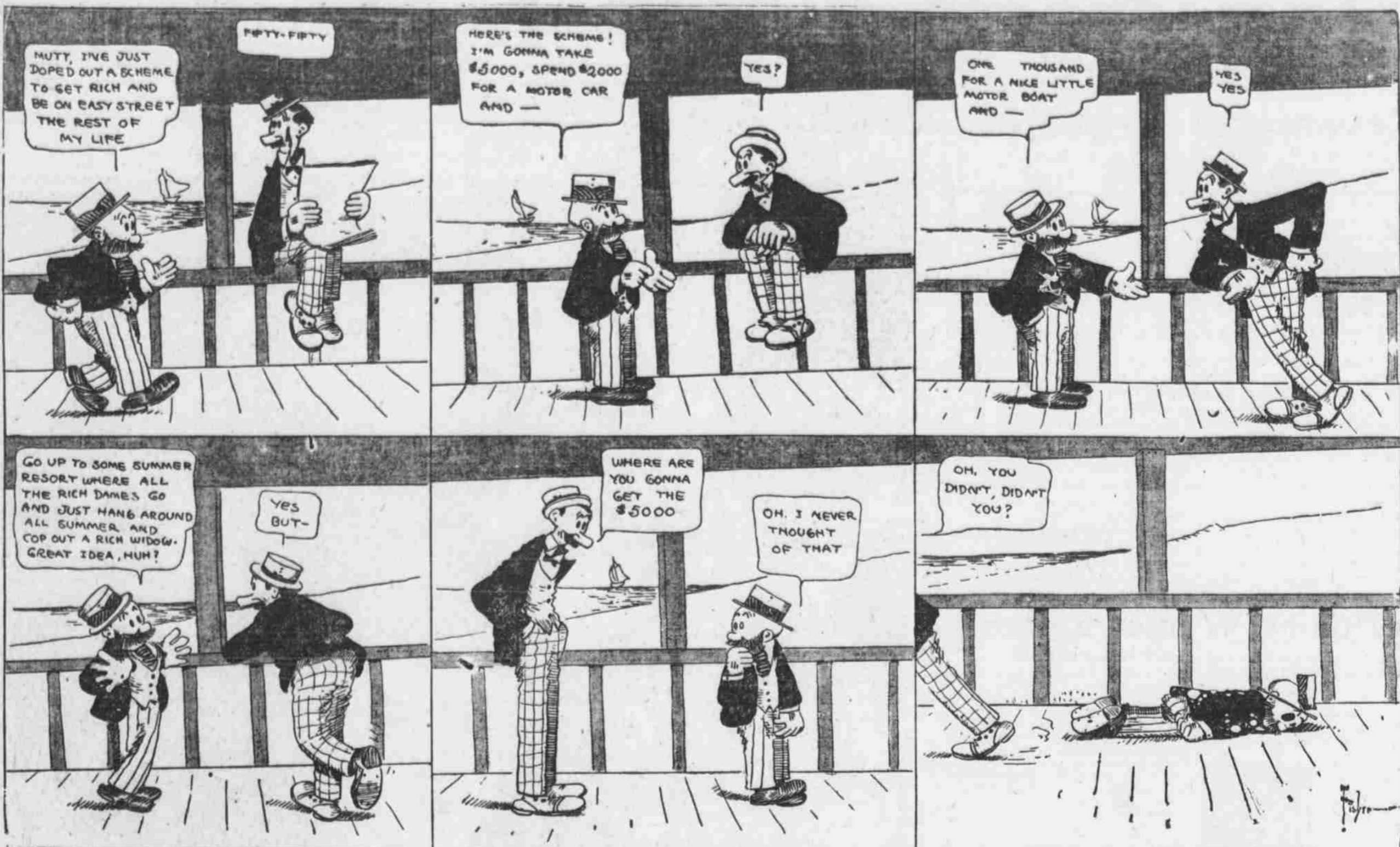
