FRUIT HERE IN ABUNDANCE. Cherries Are Now on the Market and Prices Are Reasonable. HOME GROWN CROP COMING IN. Garden and Orchard Products from Nearby Growers Are Now Being Offered Over Omaha Counters—Meats Higher.

Meats Are Higher. Hams and bacon have advanced a dollar a hundred wholesale in the last week. This means that choice sliced ham that was selling for 30 cents last week is being held at 35 cents now, retail. Salt pork is up a half dollar a hundred. This is wholesale price. Not all retailers have as yet raised the retail price, but if the rise continues there is likely to be an advance in the retail price of salt pork. Lamb is even more scarce than they have been in the last six weeks, and are very hard to get. Few of the larger retailers are able to obtain the number of lambs they want at the packing houses. Beef is fairly steady, and the supply of good heavy stuff is fairly good. Chickens are plentiful, while broilers or springers are somewhat scarce as yet. Springers are still selling at 45 cents a pound and above that.

DR. McCUNE OF KOREA ON MISSION SCHOOL PROGRAM. The Omaha Summer School of Missions opening at the University of Omaha next week has among other prominent figures on its program this year, Dr. George S. McCune, the man around whom the Japanese storm centered some two years ago at Byen Chyun, Korea, when some 200 Korean converts were imprisoned on charges of conspiracy to assassinate Premier Teruchi, a Japanese. Dr. McCune is head of a missionary school at this point. Teruchi was to visit the school. McCune and hundreds of his pupils were at the station to greet the premier and do him honor. The occasion passed off nicely and so far as Teruchi was concerned, there probably would have been no trouble. But, it seems, some politicians of a lower type got busy and stirred up an enormous fuss. Koreans were arrested preemptorily and for a long time persecutions went on without the concession of an open court trial. Finally Japanese officials went so far as to search the McCune house, under the trumped up charge that it might be concealing weapons. This proved to be a bad blunder. The late emperor of Japan so recognized it when he dispatched a personal messenger with an apology for the trespass, for there never had been any ground for suspecting the American missionary. Then came an open trial and the conspiracy charges went to the winds. The only conspiracy was what had been hatched in the cunning minds of a few Japanese politicians. Dr. McCune and family, who have old college friends in Omaha, have about concluded a year's furlough in this country and will start back to Korea in August. He is said to be a most magnetic speaker. The 1914 taxes levied are 1 1/2% per cent lighter than last year, he says, and the date the total amount of tax money paid into his office is just 12 1/2% per cent less than the amount paid in up to this date last year. Eighty-five per cent of the county and state taxes for 1913 has been received by Treasurer Ure up till today. Warrants for that proportion of the taxes had already been drawn, as permitted by law.
