Summary of weather and crop conditions in corn and wheat region for week ending June 22, 1914: In the winter wheat belt the weather was favorable for harvest, which is well under way in the southern sections, and has begun as far north as Nebraska and lows. The yield is satisfactory, except somewhat less than expected in Okiahoma and Texas. In the spring wheat beit the weather was favorable, and the crop is making excellent progress. It is most too cold for corn in some northern states, and frost did some damage, especially in Michigan, but, on the whole, the crop made good progress, with cultivation well under way and completed in many sections as far north as southern Iowa. Corn needs more moisture in portions of the Ohio vailey, Missouri, Kansas and southward. Oats and hay continue favorable in most northern and western districts. Tobacco setting still delayed, many sections lacking moisture.
