REPORT ON HEATING PLANT Withnell Ordered to Bring Figures Before Commission.

BIG SAVING FOR FIRST YEAR Amount to Be Saved for Succeeding Years Would Depend on Cost of Coal and Men to Run the Plant.

Commissioner C. H. Withnell of the department of fire protection and water supply has been instructed by the city council as a committee of whole to bring in a statistical report to show whether or not the Bee Building company's proposition to heat the city hall for \$2,650 a year is a saving which will justify the council in accepting it in lieu of installing new boilers.

Commissioner Withnell made a verbal report to the cost of connecting the Bee Building company's plant with the city hall. He said it would cost \$3,500 to make the necessary changes...

According to Commissioner Withnell's verbal report, dealing on conjectures, the Bee Building company's proposition would save the city \$1,650 the first year. The saving each following year would depend upon the amount spent for fuel, maintenance and engineers and helpers as well as light and water.
