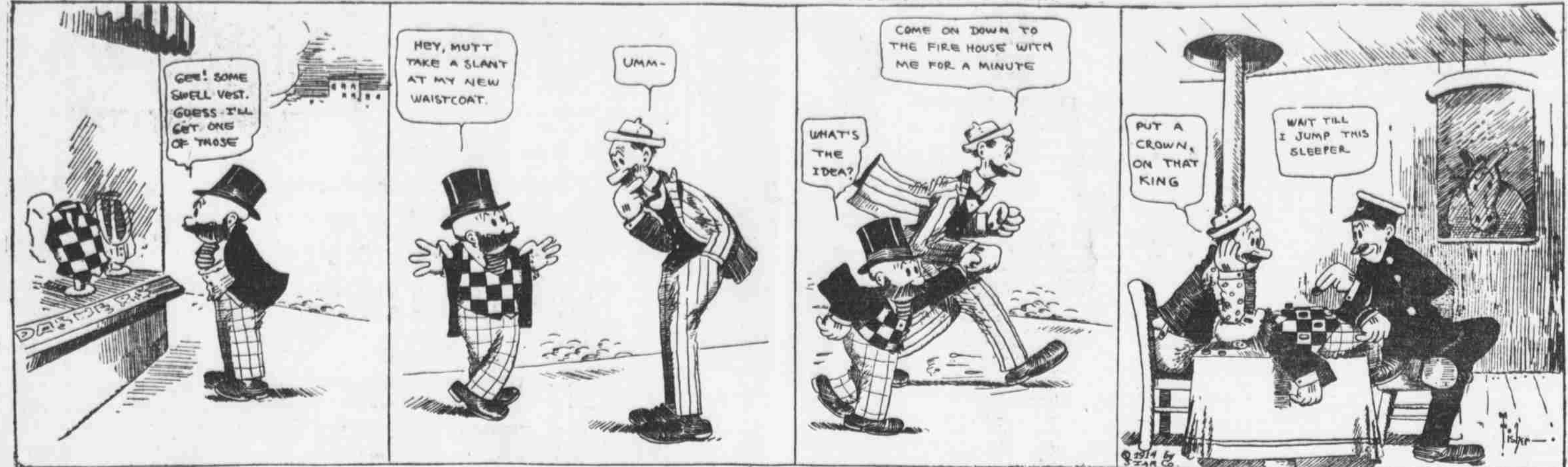


Jeff's Vest is Not Only Useful, but Ornamental

BEARS WIN IN THIRTEENTH

Denver Cops Three-Hour Pastime in Thirteenth Inning.

THREE LONG HITS IN LAST

Two Three-Baggers and a Home Run Prove Undoing of Sluggish Empire McCafferty Injured by Batted Ball.

Den Tittle and Walter Slagle both attempted to play aviator at Bourke park yesterday afternoon on two very momentous occasions, said occasions being far more momentous for the cheery Bears than for the modest Bourkes, and the impending result was the presentation of one victory to the despised Grizzlies in the thirteenth round of a more or less punk contest. The final count was 13 to 5 in favor of Denver.

The paid customers who appeared at the park to see Jay Coffey properly trounced were forced to return home disappointedly after lamping three hours of pastime. The bugs were doubly disappointed. They failed to realize their cherished ambition and they departed for sooty suppers long since chilly and scanty.

Mr. Tittle did the Curtis-Wright act in the second stanza, thus allowing five Bears to ramble over the platter and Walter made his ascension in the thirteenth when two three-baggers and a home run counted three. Mr. Eddington was handsomely attired in a bright red undershirt and he evidently thought that article of apparel called for proportionate display of pepper. He made several orations from center field, all of which were distinctly heard by the attentive bugs. But the boy orator fell down on his job when the Bourkes made a rally in the eighth, of which he refused to accept his part. This proved far more amusing to the paid customers than did the noise and they commented frequently and vociferously over this latter silent activity.

Empire Injured. The other enjoyment was the sudden reconnection of Mr. McCafferty, umpire. The ump was bumped in the neck in the opening stanza by a foul tip propelled by the bat of the boy orator. The fearless ump endeavored to stick it out, but was eventually forced to remove himself in favor of Messrs. Grover and Gaskill, who did as best they could, which wasn't much. The blow was a vicious one and McCafferty is recommended for sticking as long as he did.

Artie Thomson was the demon athlete of the day. Five swats complied Tommy and he pulled a nifty shoestring catch in the center park which would make Tris Speaker look like a piker. The Denver persons counted in the very opening inning, but Omaha did likewise. This put it up to Coffey strong and he ordered his men to chase Tittle from the mound. This they did, making five runs in the act. Cloosman came to his rescue and did nobly. He held the mound in gentle to four hits and was only called aside to let Krueger hit for him.

King Goes Into Box. The second saw Omaha with another and the fourth also. The sixth counted one more and in the eighth the fireworks were directed toward Collegian King, successor to Harrington. Four runs were made in the eighth and the score was tied and one to the good. Walter Slagle was sent to the box and he made the mistake of his life by allowing the visitors to count one in the ninth, knocking the count. As Barney Schreiber was hustled to the firing line the Bourkes did nothing further, but Denver did. In the thirteenth Slagle went skyward. Coffey and Butcher tripled and after Block was off Fisher boosted one over the right field wall. Four runs and agony for the bugs. This so took the pep out of the Bourkes that revenge was impossible.
