IRISH QUESTION IS SETTLED

Liverpool Post Says Only Few Details Remain to Be Adjusted. KING GEORGE STAYS IN LONDON

His Majesty is Watching Reports of Conference Between Leaders - Tyrone County to Be Deeded to the Ulster.

LONDON, July 18.—King George, who has been making great efforts to bring about a settlement of the Irish home rule crisis later in the day his proposed visit to the great British fleet, now lying at Spithead. This he did that he might be in London to receive early reports of developments in the conference going on between the various party leaders.

Other authorities do not go quite so far, but satisfy themselves with the statement "there is a near approach to a settlement."

The government is believed to have offered the Unionists, in case they agree to abandon their demand for a "clean cut" of the province of Ulster out of the operations of the Irish home rule bill, to arrange that the whole of Ulster, with the exception of the county of Tyrone, which has a great Catholic majority, should vote as an entity on the question of exclusion from the home rule government. The Unionists demand that Tyrone should be included in this arrangement and this has been the cause of the deadlock.

Premier Asquith and Augustine Birrell, secretary of state for Ireland, who are carrying on the negotiations on behalf of the cabinet, have remained in town for the week-end. The premier today held another audience with the king. The rest of the cabinet ministers scattered over the country for their weekly holiday.

Man Who Would Start Masonic Republic Not Known to Masons

STORM LAKE, Ia., July 18.—(Special.)—A Storm City Friday morning paper contained an account of the activities of one, Edward Buckley, who claims to be the president of a so-called African Masonic republic, and who is said to have been traveling throughout the middle west in search of cabinet members for his "republic."

Among the more prominent agencies of the fraternal organization, which has been on its trail in the American Freeman of Storm Lake, Ia., of which Joseph E. Morcombe is the head, and headline, which was published in the Sioux City newspaper, evidently has led to the downfall of the embryo president.

It is stated in high authority that Editor J. E. Morcombe of the Freeman, after learning that Buckley had gone to Sioux Falls, notified the Masons in that city of his claim and asked them to investigate his doings. The reply came back that the man was evidently of unsound mind, carried away with an exaggerated idea of his own importance, and in every way irresponsible. There is a further investigation on foot to find who or what influences are lack of this very peculiar demonstration.

High Masons, throughout the United States, whom he claims to have taken into his confidence, deny any connection with or any knowledge of his operations, and indications point to a thorough investigation of his activities.

Czar Will Abolish Tax on Emigrants

ST. PETERSBURG, Russia, July 18.—Russia is about to recognize as legitimate the emigration of its surplus millions to countries other than those in Europe, and the ministry of commerce today submitted to the cabinet a bill to abolish some of the penalties hitherto attaching to unauthorized emigration.
