

DAN TIPPLE BAFFLES LINKS

Rourke Twirler Holds Lincoln Athletes to Two Scratch Hits.

STRIKES OUT FOURTEEN MEN

Every Link Except Miller Whiffs at Least Once, Some Twice and Rourke and Smith Three Times.

Daniel Tipple, the well known pulchritudinous athlete who has just been invited to act as a model in the big fashion show scheduled to appear at the Auditorium because of the comeliness of his figure and the symmetry and dignity of his athletic form, didn't do a thing to the Links from Lincoln yesterday afternoon. What he did do was to keep the Links from Lincoln from getting any batting practice, for he whiffed every Link except Miller who whiffed at least once, some twice and Rourke and Smith three times.

For five innings the Lincoln batting record was devoid of those desirable quantities of base ball called base hits. Then Blackburne broke the ice with a hit through third, which Rourke should have nailed but didn't. McLaughlin in the seventh made the second blow with a poke to left which a faster man than Congalton might have nabbed up. But at that let us be thankful for that which we have to hand.

Every gink on the Capital team except Miller whiffed at least once. Several fanned the air twice and Rourke and Smith went to the plate three times and performed faithfully for their native country. Some class in the record for this circuit is sixteen.
