Mack Says He Is Not Worrying Over the Federal League, as He Has Signed Practically All His Players.

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 25.-"The Red Sox may be playing better ball, but they cannot overhaul my team," said Connie Mack, manager of the world's champion Athletics, "We lead the American league by a safe margin. The Atheltics have net some games recently simply because of a surprising slomp in batting. After one or two men have hit safely the neceseary punch to bring them home hasn't materialized. But the slump is only temporary. The men will be hitting right up to their best form when they begin the world's series,

"Our pitchers are in good shape. Bender and Plank have done better this year than ever before in point of winning percentage. Bush and Shawkey also have shown improvement. Of the other pitchers I think young Bressler, a left-hander. may prove the 'most successful in time. Bressler has learned rapidly and posseeses much natural ability. He will be called upon frequently during the rest of the season, so that he may gain plenty of experience. I don't believe it is necessary to talk about my regulars. They are just as formidable as a year ago. They are winning their fourth pennant in five years and that achievement speaks for

McGraw in Same Mess.

'McGraw is experiencing the same trouble I had with the Athletics in 1912. The Giants have won three pennants so easily that they probably have been overconfident all acason. They doubtless have believed that no other team could outfoot them. Maybe the motor car fever has had something to do with their failure to asume a commanding lead.

'In 1912 the Athletics had their pockets filled with world's series money. They bought automobiles and took life easy. They were sure that it would be a cinch to win another championship and they didn't walte up until they found the Red fox far ahead of them,

The trouble with ball players in these days is too much money and a tendency to pay more attention to outside recreation than to their duties on the field. But the Athletics, remembering what happened in 1912, have been exceptions to the rule this year. They have attended strictly to business and there is no fault to find with them."

Mack is not worrying about the Federal league. He signed practically all of his players for 1915. When Eddie Collins capitulated Mack was happy. It has been rumored that Collins might jump to the Feds: that he had received a big offer from the Wards and had agreed to consider it. But when Mack was ready to talk business the famous second baseman showed his gratitude by putting his name

Collins' Opportunity. If it hadn't been for Mack's willing-ness to try out Collins the latter probably never would have gained renown. Grit-fith and McGraw had refused to experiment with the former Columbia student before he was recommended to the Athletics' leader, Mack, therefore made Collins, and Collins said he was entitied to first call.

It's a strange thing that the Athletics have not drawn the usual attendance in Philadelphia this year. Mack says he account for it. Other base ball men seem to think that the lack of interest is due to the superiority of the champions over the other American eague teams. Quaker fans have come to regard the winning of a world's series each year as a foregone conclusion. Yet in apite of the falling off in gate receipts Mack has kept the team going at top speed, with the result that business in other American league cities has been greatly reduced too.

Ira Thomas, one of Mack's lieutenants. said that the Athletics would beat the Braves in the world's series, provided Stallings' men finished on top, as easily as they disposed of the Giants last year. Thomas seemed to think that in the big games the Athletics would lit the Braves pitchera without experiencing much trouble, while Mack's boxmen would hold
