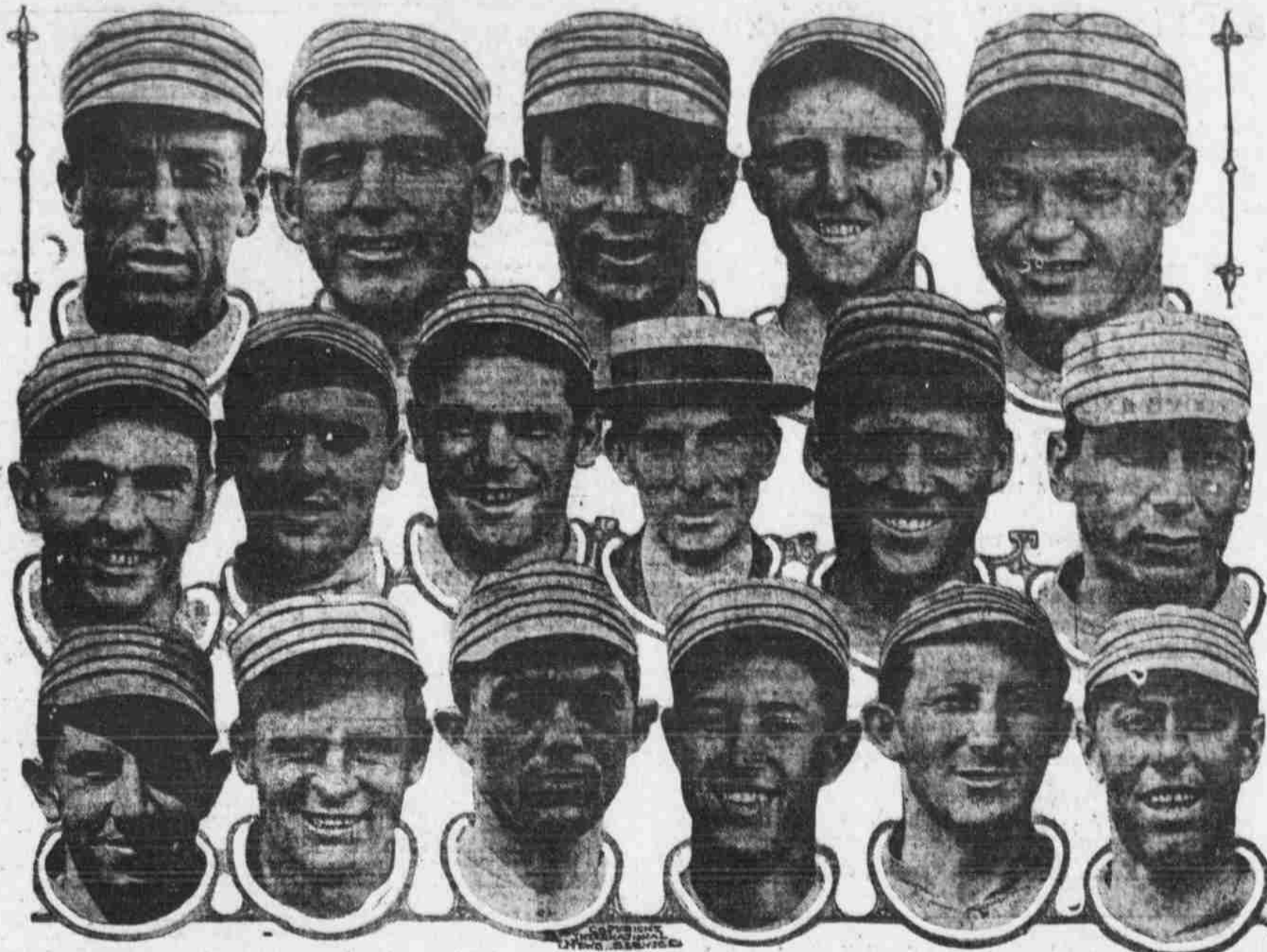


Connie Mack's Famous Athletics, Champions of World Now and Ready for Another

World's Series Teams Have Same Number of Moundmen.

ATHLETICS WEAK LAST YEAR

Plank and Bender Only Dependable Men Then—Each Nine Has at Least Eight Splendid Twirlers Now.

NEW YORK, Oct. 6.—So far as the numerical strength of the pitching staff of the Philadelphia Athletics and Boston Braves are concerned, the rival league pennant winners will enter the world's series on equal terms. Each club has at least eight pitchers who can be called into action, but it is not likely, however, that more than 50 per cent of this hurling staff will step to the mound during the coming diamond conflict.

Last year before the world's series began the only weakness in the Athletics appeared to be in the pitchers' box. Plank and Bender were the only twirlers who could be counted upon with reasonable certainty. Providing Bender and Plank have not lost any of their speed and cunning, and they have been consistent winners throughout this year's American league campaign, Mack is better fortified with pitchers than he was a year ago.

Impressed with Bressler. Fans who have been watching the work of the Athletics have been impressed with the work of Bressler, the newest twirler on the team. He has been as steady as a clock, has great speed and a puzzling cross-fire ball that has earned him the title of the "second Eddie Plank."
