

DES MOINES, Ia., Oct. 10 .- (Special Telegram.)-Superintendent Rothert of the State School for the Deaf appeared before the state railroad commission today in the matter of a claim for demurrage against the school because of the delay in handling coal cars. He snowed that the cars, originally from the Wabash, were handled to the school by the street car company and that the institution officials were not at fault, so that as far as the school is concerned, the demurrage claim will be dropped. It now amounts to over \$1,000. The railroad commission has no authority to order the board of control to pay the same.

Tabernacle to Be Built. The trouble over the building of a special tabernacle for "Billy" Sunday came to a termination today and the courts refuse to interfere in any way with the lo cation of same near residences and buslness blocks down town. The court held that there was no added danger to other property. The property owners threaten to go to the supreme court but may not do so.
