About Washington Meeting.

British Finance Minister and Officials of U. S. Treasury Discuss Matters Bearing on Opening of Exchanges.

NEW YORK, Oct. 20.—Interest in financial affairs today centered mainly around Washington, where further conferences were held between representatives of the British finance minister and officials of the United States treasury and in which some of the prominent banking interests of the country were participants.

The outcome of these meetings, which ere to be continued in this city, is expected to have a very direct bearing, not only upon existing foreign exchange conditions, but also upon the reopening of the London and New York stock exchanges.
