The legislature will be asked to pass an appropriation set to pay for the live stock slaughtered under federal authority in the fight on the foot and mouth discase in Iows. The entire value, as estimated, is now about \$60,666 and the state will be asked to pay half of this sum by a direct appropriation. There will have to be an emergency appropriation also for paying the cost of the department in the work of handling the quarantine.

It is now lanned that every herd within fifteen miles of any place where there has been any outbreak shall be inspected by Dr. Paxton of th federal bureau and his assistants. Orders have been issued that in the infected area there shall be ne public sales of live stock or short course exhibitions of live stock.

Iowa Military Strongth.
Adjutant General Logan has secured from the auditors of the counties the lists inished the purchase of ground for the of persons in Iowa subject to military duty and these show that there has been an increase the last two years in the militia force of the state. For 1912 the assessors returned the names of 303.30 persons between 15 and 45 years of age This year they listed 319,866 persons subject to military duty. Some of the countles showed losses, but most of them showed some gains.

Asking for Parole. The State Board of Parole has under consideration the request of E. D. Faats, a young man of Dubuque, for parole before commitment. He has been convicted of larceny by embezziement and given an indeterminate sentence. Faatz was connected with an express company. The board has also taken under advisement again the case of Mrs. Betsy Smith, who is serving a life term from this county

and who seeks pardon. Claim Against Estate. A volunteer detective, S. T. Waterman, has made a claim against the estate of the late William Rainsbarger of Hardin county for \$1,600 as compensation for his services in working up a case to secure parole for the Rainsbarger brothers. Waterman claims to have had a verbal contract with the brother who died last year covering that amount. He had prepared material to be presented to the board, but when he was last here was not permitted to present the same. May Not Widen Narrow Gauge.

The State Railroad commission is still in doubt as to what to do in the matter of ordering the Milwaukee Railroad company to widen its narrow guage track to Cascade, Dubuque county, or to construct a new line. The legislature authorized the commission to investigate and if deemed necessary, order that a standard guage be adopted. The company filed a statement showing estimated cost of construction of an entire new line or cost of rebuilding the old line. The fact is that the line is so crooked and the valley through which it runs is so narrow that the line cannot very well be widened and a new route would be selected for the line of thirty-three rolles. The people interested are now engaged in checking over the estimates.
