

SEES REPUBLICAN REUNION COMING

Late Progressive Nominee for Governor of New York Says Depends on Conditions.

HUGHES AN IDEAL CANDIDATE

"The complete reunion of the progressives and republicans depends entirely upon the course pursued by the republicans and the character of their candidates. I admit that the progressive party cannot be a positive factor, but it will be a negative factor if conditions reshape themselves as they were before."

This is the expression of Frederick M. Davenport, the progressive nominee for governor in New York last fall, stopping over in Omaha a few hours with Mrs. Davenport while making a tour of the west.

Mr. Davenport is professor of economics in Hamilton college and served in the state senate under Governor Hughes, with whom he has been intimately acquainted.

"Hughes would be an ideal candidate for president," he said, "but I am not in position to tell whether he would consent to run. He certainly would have to be drafted, because he would not make a canvass for the nomination."

Prof. Davenport is utilizing his vacation year to look into economic conditions in different parts of the country. Incidentally he is also scouting for the short ballot reform movement, representing the national organization, and to that end carries a letter from President Wilson to Governor Morehead, the president being the honorary head of the national short ballot organization.
