ENEMIES GET "GOLD TOOTH" Old Yeggman's Body Found on Rails in South Dakota Town...

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POLICE BELIEVE IT MURDER The dead body of "Gold-tooth Johnnie," known also as "Duluth Johnnie," was found last week on railroad tracks in a small South Dakota village...

Call It Murder. His death, apparently accidental, is called murder by Detective Ed Fleming, who has known "The Gold-tooth" for the last few years.

"The Gold-tooth" was prominent in his line, the detective related. He got his name from the big gold tooth in his lower jaw—a tooth that stood out like a juk. It always identified him.

"Yegg" Detective. "He was about 45 years old and had been a criminal most of his life. He was 25 years old before he ever saw the inside of a jail, however, but when he did, it broke him, body and soul. He came out a crushed, whining piece of humanity. After that a number of crooks were caught with the goods on them, immediately after a 'job' none of the 'yeggs,' though, ever after they were sent in prison, could figure it out.

The fact is, the intervarsity Cyclone treasury was exactly \$60.15 in the hole when the 1914 bills rang in this annum.
