Grand Jury to Probe The Acts of Strikers

NEW BRUNSWICK, N. J., Jan. 26.—In charging the county grand jury that assembled here today to take testimony regarding the shooting of nineteen strikers last Tuesday at the Liebig plant of the American Agricultural Chemical company at Roosevelt, Supreme Court Justice

Bergen said that strikers could be held responsible for any act of theirs that damaged property or endangered life.

The justice said also he had been informed that Mayor Hermann of Roosevelt was in open sympathy with the strikers and had not curbed their unlawful assemblages, and that the jury should investigate this feature.

Twenty-seven deputies alleged to have taken part in the shooting are in jail under charges of first-degree murder.

Two of the nineteen strikers shot died. In his charge Justice Bergen said the court had heard that in this case the strikers had assembled in a riotous manner.

GERMAN CRUISER IS DAMAGED BY TORPEDO

MALMOE, Sweden, Jan. 26.—(Via London.)—It is persistently asserted here that the German protected cruiser Gassel was torpedoed yesterday by a submarine of unknown nationality, at a point in the Baltic near the island of Ruegen, which is off the coast of Prussia.

Although the Gassel was damaged, it was able to return to the port of Sase-nitz.

Germans Planting Mines at Entrance to Gulf of Bothnia

LONDON, Jan. 26.—The German armored cruiser Friedrich Carl and a numerous group of torpedo boats were seen today off the Aland islands, at the entrance to the Gulf of Bothnia, steering south.

The foregoing dispatch, if correct, disproves a story from Petrograd over a month ago to the effect that the Friedrich Carl had been sunk in the Baltic during a naval sortie from one of the German bases. It is a cruiser of 8,800 tons and was launched in 1902.
