NEW YORK, Peb. II.—The apprehension and uncertainty attending international conditions were once more potent factors in today's duil and heavy stock market. Trading was ultra-professional and mainly on the short side, in the early seesion that faction renewed its attacks on leading shares, which fell a point or more, coaiers showing greatest weakness.
