GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Cash Wheat Goes Up Two to Three
Cents and July Future Strong
on the Market.
CORN AND OATS SALES HEAVY

OMAHA, March 13, 1915.
Armour brokers were buyers of May
wheat the entire day. It was generally
believed the buying was to cover out-
standing contracts rather than to make
delivery of the grain during the month of
May and take a chance of losing the
market.

It is expected by many that cash wheat
will be scarce in the Chicago market dur-
ing May. The July future, which is a
new crop month, was high, because of
a new buying power, which was consid-
ered stronger than the selling. Foreigners
were reported as buying heavily and
July futures here. Sales of cash wheat
for export helped to strengthen the
entire situation. The May future closed
2 1/2¢ better, and the July was up 1 1/2¢.

The public was not in wheat yester-
day. The market was quiet. The
Wall street crowd was noticeable, but
these big and wild traders were doubt-
less speculating. The market was
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Argentine shipments this week were
small, at 3,000 bushels. Since Janu-
ary these shipments have been 17,200,000
bushels, compared with 14,000,000 bushels
for a like period a year ago. Argentine
wheat supply increased 1,000,000 bushels
last week, and is now 4,000,000 bushels
compared with 7,000,000 bushels a year
ago. Clearances of breadstuffs from
South America this week were 7,700,000
bushels. Last week were 4,800,000 bushels,
and for a like period a year ago were
3,700,000 bushels. Corn clear-
ances last week were 1,100,000 bushels,
against 1,000,000 bushels a year ago.

Corn and oats displayed considerable
strength. Cash sales of corn were 50,000
bushels at Chicago, and 100,000 bushels
at Omaha. Cash price was 50¢ bushels.
The board reported 400,000 bushels oats
sold there.

which caused a heavier feeling early in

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NEW YORK STOCK MARKET

Trading on Exchange Narrow, Dull
and Altogether Too Pro-
fessional.

NEW YORK, March 13.—Stock trading
today was narrow, dull and altogether
too professional, the latter element in-
creasingly prominent. The market was
known to be covering some of the
outstanding commitments. Specialties,
more particularly the motor group, moved
to lower levels on further profit-taking,
but showed some recuperative powers in
final dealings. Market leaders were
disposed to sag at the close, but closed
the day with moderate gains.

Yesterday's suspension of the preferred
dividend on the part of the New York
Central was particularly noted. It was
followed by renewed heaviness in the stock
and bonds. Foreign markets were easier,
except Italian securities, which held at
the previous day's final quotation and
gave rise to further conjecture respecting
financial arrangements between our
bankers and Italian interests.

London's market was firm, the new war
and exchequer bonds showing special
interest. Little activity was seen for
American securities. Rumors were current
of an impending price revision of
our stocks by authorities of the London
exchange.

The principal feature of the local bank
statement was the increase of about 500,000
in the loan account. Much of this
expansion was traceable to the shifting
of loans connected with the new govern-
ment bond sale. There was a normal
gain in cash, with a small increase in ex-
pected reserves.

The bond market showed an easier
tone. Total sales, par value, aggregated
\$1,340,000.
