Milk in Restaurants is Investigated by Health Department

Inspection of milk in restaurants and other public places has resulted in Health Commissioner R. W. Connell summoning several prominent milk dealers to his office for a conference.

The samples of milk taken and examined showed that the milk was not quite up to the legal standard. The reports of the chemist did not warrant filing complaints in the police court...

The requirement, that all milk sold in public places be served from the original bottles, bearing the names of the producers, makes it easy for the health department to hold the dealers for the quality of the milk.
