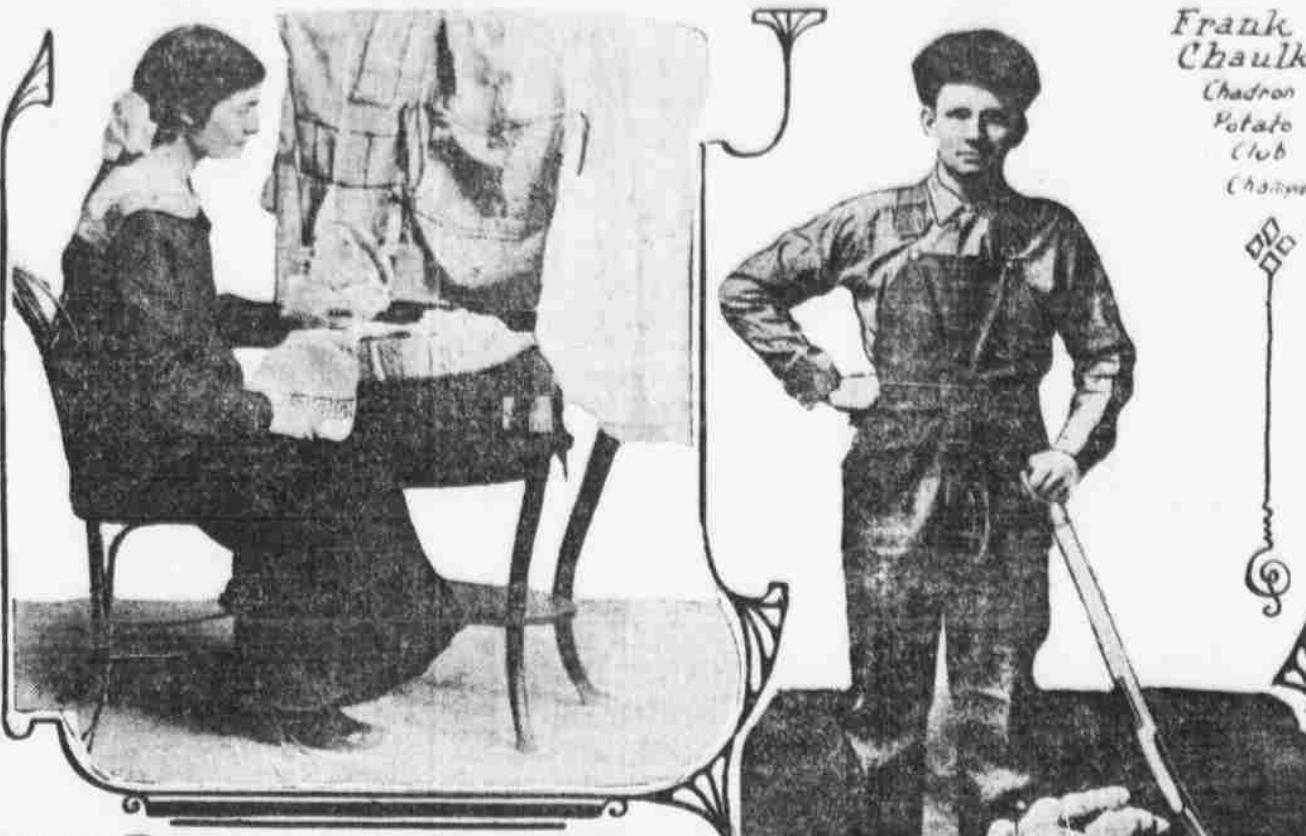

Nebraska Youngsters Who Really Do Things

The youngsters of Nebraska in city, village and country alike have set themselves earnestly to the task of improving the state's knowledge of agriculture and of the duties of the home, judging from the membership of the Nebraska boys' and girls' clubs conducted co-operatively by the United States Department of Agriculture and the agricultural extension service, university farm at Lincoln.

Last year, one of the first years this work has been carried on in the state, there were 2,300 members, and this year the number is expected to be more than doubled.

Any boy or girl in Nebraska may join one of these clubs without cost. As soon as the membership blank is received, the name is placed on the mailing list of the monthly lesson bulletins. The lessons are written by specialists in their line at the university farm and are intended to assist in any way possible the member to understand the work.

Besides sending the instructions the extension service has made it possible for the club members to compete for \$2,000 in prizes. This year the amount of prizes has been amply enlarged.

Last year five championships were awarded. These were offered in corn, potatoes, gardening, cooking and sewing. This year the pig club has been organized, and competition will be held for the championship.

The winner of the corn championship was Vyrlie Crowell, aged 12, of Walthill. Vyrlie was awarded a free trip to Washington and over \$50 in prizes. He raised 52.46 bushels of corn on his acre without applying fertilizer. Although this was not the highest yield of those entered in the contest, it was the largest produced with the smallest corresponding cost and the one best accounted for. In the war of championships the yield, quality, cost, report, and story of the crop are all taken into consideration.

The champion potato grower was Frank Chaulk of Chadron. Frank raised twenty-five bushels of potatoes on an upland patch of an eighth acre with only 2.5-12

inches of rainfall which fell between July 2 and September 5. He used no fertilizer and did not irrigate. It is held to be an unusual showing considering the low moisture content of the soil.

Myrtle Mann, aged 12, of Chadron won the gardening club championship. She raised over a ton and a quarter of vegetables at a net profit of \$71.80. The

size of her plot was a little over half the size of the average city lot.

Irene Pegg, aged 11, of Red Cloud captured both the sewing and cooking club championships.

Membership blanks and rules for the contest may be obtained from the state leader in charge at the university farm, Lincoln.

Convicted of Theft, Ask Habeas Corpus
Joseph, Bernard and Peter Miller and Ed Malone of South Omaha, who allege they were convicted of concealing stolen property by the South Omaha police court, while they were not present, sought release at the hands of District Judge English by habeas corpus proceedings. The judge has not yet decided the case.

Whether the plaintiff might rightfully be convicted, though not in court, is a constitutional question in issue. A request of an old statute and the passage of a new one by the legislature also is involved another complication.

Deep Snow Still Covers Range in South Dakota

General Manager Walters of the Northwestern is in from a trip over the Bonesteel-Winner branch, extending up into South Dakota and returns surprised at the amount of snow still on the ground through northern Nebraska and the southern part of South Dakota. Said Mr. Walters:

"We are not experiencing any difficulty now on account of snow, but in the event there should be a strong wind, our Bonesteel-Winner branch would again be blocked. Up in that section of the country there has been but little warm weather. It has not thawed enough to form a crust on the top of the snow. Generally the snow still covers the ground to a depth of eighteen inches to two feet and in many places there are drifts that I should say are ten to fifteen feet high.

"Live stock has not suffered, because farmers and ranchers have had plenty of feed. The animals have been kept under shelter and given close attention. They have not been able to graze, as the range has been and still is deep under the snow."

Local railroad freight officials are in receipt of information to the effect that the Interstate Commerce commission has suspended the advance of 5 per cent asked by the rail and water lines, that their rates might be on parity with those of the all-rail lines east of the Mississippi river.

Last fall the freight lines of eastern trunk line territory applied for permission to advance rates throughout the territory east of Buffalo and soon after this, the road of the central territory, including that between the Mississippi river and Buffalo asked to make a similar advance in rates, 5 per cent. The advance was granted about the first of the year, but this applied to the all-rail lines.

Following the advance granted the all-rail lines, the rail and water lines asked leave to make a 5 per cent advance. Hearing on the application was had and now comes the report that the proposed rate has been suspended until July 15 and in the meantime there will be another hearing before the commission.

Local railroad men are of the opinion that the action of the commission will result in the rail and water lines doing practically all the freight business between Chicago and New York, and that at least all of the slow freight routed either into or out of Omaha will be handled by boat and rail east of Chicago, instead of by rail exclusively.

Prior to the advance in rates east of the Mississippi river, the rail and water rate during the open season was around 5 cents per hundred less than by the all rail route on everything that we handled between Chicago and New York. Now, with the all rail rates being raised 5 per cent, it is figured that the rail and water lines will do the business, at least until after the hearing in July, when the water lines hope for permission to advance their rates.
