Berlin Milk Dealers Must Stand By Price

BERLIN, March 39.—Berlin milk dealers he are fearful that there may be a milk mine have appealed to the Board of Trade of the capital to induce the authorities to start action against farmers who, it is claimed, have falled to live up to price agreements.

Dealers maintain that the farmers annually feed billions of liters of skimmed milk to their hogs, at a loss of 150,000 liters of aubimin a year. They ask that this use of skimmed milk be restricted and that freight rates for the transportstion of the milk be reduced by one-half.

The authorities are asked to remind the farmers that they must live up to their previous agreements with the Berlin dealers. If the officials do not step in, the dealers believe the present shortage of milk will develop into a milk famine.
