Ancient Mortgage Settled by Church

An old mortgage, dated 1887, well plantered with war tax stamps and bearing the signatures of pioneers, most of whom are now dead, has just been settled by the First Presbyterian church It was placed on the church property at Seventeenth and Dodge streets, recently sold to the Brandels Interests, to secure a loan of \$2,000, made by the national board of church erection to what was then the Second Presbyterian church, for the purpose of building the present structure. The five trustees who signed the mortgage died years ago, but the witnesses, B. E. B. Kennedy and Lewis Reed, are still alive.
