Sixteen Persons Killed by Storm in Texas; 11 Missing

AUSTIN, Tex., April 24.—Flood relief work in the districts devastated by Thursday night's rain and electrical storm proceeded rapidly today under clear skies.

City authorities, churches and charitable institutions co-operated in the work.

Revised list of the drowned and missing today gives the number of drowned whose bodies have been recovered at fourteen, and the number of missing, believed to be drowned, as eleven.

Railway service was resumed partly today and salvaging of scores of wrecked houses begun. City officials estimate the loss to streets and bridges at \$200,000 and the total loss at approximately \$1,000,000.

Two other deaths due to the storm, one at Christoval and the other at Ransdell, brings the number of known dead in Texas to sixteen.
