STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERS DEGREES

Victim of Lusitania Disaster Among Students on List of Honors Awarded by Faculty.

SOME SENIORS FALL BY WAYSIDE

LINCOLN, June 8.—(Special.)—A victim of the Lusitania tragedy was awarded a degree in the graduate college of the State university yesterday, when the faculty met and passed finally upon the list of graduates which was presented to the university Board of Regents today for their approval.

Indu Prakas Banerji, a Hindu, a graduate of the University of Calcutta, president of the Cosmopolitan club of the State university, and said to have delivered one of the most remarkable addresses heard here at the occasion of his inauguration, was given a master's degree in sociology and political economy, although it is believed he was one of the many who went down with the Lusitania. Banerji sailed on the boat, according to the message which Dr. Dean R. Leland, the Presbyterian university minister received from the vice president of the Cunard line, after the university authorities had interested themselves in his behalf. He was not among the list of saved and undoubtedly perished, the Cunard official word.

To prevent any chance of mistake, the faculty granted the degree, however, Banerji hurried away before the university closed to reach the bedside of his aged father, who was reported to be critically ill. A cablegram he received in New York caused him to cancel passage on a later ship and take the Lusitania. He had planned to serve as a missionary to his people and was looking forward to securing his master's degree.
