HOLMES IS GIVEN WARM RECEPTION

Makes Debut in Western League for Omaha and Wolves Hammer Daylights Out of Him.

COCHRAN ALLOWS THREE HITS

WICHITA, Kan., June 8.—(Special Telegram.)—Jimmy Holmes blew into Wichita today from Venice, Cal., joined the fourmen, went into the game and had the daylights hammered out of him by the desperate Wolves, who entered the fray determined to win at least on combat of the four. Wichita won easily, 10 to 0. It all happened in the second inning. The wily Wolves began to feed Mr. Holmes bunts and he got his fill in a few minutes. Of five hits made in that round, three were bunts which Jimmy should have converted into outs. Also James was wild and passed Gest, a weak hitter, with the bases full, thus forcing one marker over. Six runs were made during that round and the fourmen curled up and died.

Barney Everson came in as a rescuer, but he had nothing to rescue and his rescuing wasn't much to brag about. In the sixth Wichita rammed five marks into the hit column, including three of the two-sack variety, and three more runs trickled over the well known plate. Again in the seventh Wares' crew got ram-hungry. Three hits, two of them doubles, chalked two more runs, making the total eleven.

Cochran is stingy. On the other hand Choke Tom Cochran was howling along in his sleekest vein. He certainly had the Rourke artillery spiked, from start to finish. Doc Payne reeled off two hits, one a triple, but his mates were not behind him with the necessary punch. The triple came in the eighth with no out, but Schlieber popped a foul to Fisher, Smith rolled out, and Whalen hit to Tydemann. Dick Brown made the remaining hit in the fourth, but was quickly suppressed. Mathewson Will Be Out of Game for Several Weeks

CHICAGO, June 8.—Christy Mathewson will be out of base ball for several weeks, it was said today, after the pitching star of the New York National base ball team had undergone a rigid examination by a nerve specialist. Suffering from a nervous disorder of the left shoulder, Mathewson has been unable to take his regular turn in pitching for some time, and when the club reached Chicago he was obliged to place himself under the care of a specialist. He had been unable to sleep more than three hours a night he said, because of the pain. The disorder extended to the right shoulder yesterday. Veteran base ball men who have discussed the case with Mathewson are of the opinion that he is suffering from the same affliction that robbed big Ed Walsh of the Chicago American's of his pitching ability two years ago. Any violent exertion causes sharp pains to shoot through Mathewson's shoulder and neck. The veteran pitcher will be obliged to rest and undergo treatment for several weeks, it was said.
