CONDUCTOR KILLED ON UNION PACIFIC

Frank Pfisterer, with No. 4, Struck by Engine No. 12 at Overton, Nebraska.

LIVED WITH FAMILY IN OMAHA

Frank Pfisterer, Twenty-fourth and Ogden streets, this city, one of the oldest passenger train conductors in the employ of the Union Pacific, was instantly killed at Overton at 1:30 o'clock Thursday morning. The funeral will be held Saturday at 2 p. m. at the residence, 5402 North Twenty-fourth street. Pfisterer was conductor on No. 4, the Atlantic Express, and had gone on the siding in order to let No. 12, the Colorado Special, eastbound, pass. Soon after stopping he walked around to the front of his train to care for a hot box on a fruit car behind the engine and was caught by the Colorado Special which does not make the Overton stop. He was struck squarely by the engine and killed instantly. The dead man is survived by a wife and three grown children. He had been with the Union Pacific close to thirty years, having worked from brakeman up to passenger train conductor.

Elkhorn Road to Run Two Special Trains to Wrestling Match

Joe Hetmanek, manager for Joe Stecher, in writing from the home of the Nebraska Wonder, to the sporting editor of The Bee, says that the entire population of that section of the country will be in Omaha for the Speedway races and for the wrestling match. He writes in part:

"I have just completed arrangements with the Chicago & Northwestern for special trains, one on the Albia branch, which will arrive in Omaha about 10 o'clock that morning and start back after the match. There will also be a special train to carry the people back home on the main line to Norfolk."
