This is not given as a boost for betting either way, but simply to chronicle the facts as they appear. There is no doubt there will be a large sum bet on the outcome of the contest.

Taking the dope as he should be Cutler should carry the odds, as he is the champion, has had years of experience, has met the best men in the world and is in the prime of condition. On the other hand the best man Stecher has thrown is Ernst, whom Cutler can put down in a few minutes. But the wise ones will tell you Stecher will win, but they cannot tell you why. He is a powerful youth who has never been thrown but once, and that time three years ago by Earl Caddock, the amateur wrestling champ, who is now in the Cutler training squad. At that time three falls were called in fifteen minutes, of which Stecher was given two and Caddock one.
