MANY ARE TO BE DRAFTED

But two Western league players were purchased by major league clubs this year. Yesterday the season on purchasing closed and all players in the league are now eligible to be drafted.

That applications for a number of Western league athletes will be made in the draft is certain. The number of scouts who have visited this territory and then returned for a second investigation of the potential ivory players that point.
