Already several thousands of dollars' worth of damage has been done to the property of the company. Frank Elgan, as district superintendent

had been warned several times that he was to be murdered. Other officials re-ceived word that the telephone company buildings were to be blown up.

Yesterday it was discovered that an at tempt had been made to burn the Elgan home, and the excitement reached a high pitch.

Mothers of girls working as operators refused to permit their daughters to leave ome, and every employe and friend of those connected with the telephone com pany became uneasy.
