OMAHA PROUD OF ITS GRAIN MARKET

One of the Leading Institutions Which Have Made Omaha the Bi-Commercial Center.

STICKNEY SHOWED THE WAY

Eleven years ago Omaha was without a grain market. There were elevators and grain buyers, but they were not making a market for the grain of Nebraska, Iowa and Omaha trade territory. They simply bought such grain as happened to come along and when a carload was gathered together it was sent along, going to Chicago, Minneapolis or St. Louis.

Something like eleven years ago A. B. Stickney, then president of the Chicago Great Western Railroad company, upon one of his visits here, called a number of the grain and business men together and up to them he put the question: "Why don't you have a grain market in Omaha?"

Mr. Stickney was informed that upon numerous occasions attempts had been made to establish a market, but that each attempt had been met with failure. Said he:

Tells Them How.

"Let me tell you how to make a market here. The way to do it is to make the market. Lying at your doors you have the richest agricultural country on the face of the globe and there is no excuse for letting every bushel of wheat, corn, oats and other varieties of grain raising in Omaha trade territory go on to other cities without first stopping here to later be converted into food products, or diverted to the great market centers of the world."

Pointing out the way, before the return of Mr. Stickney to his home in Minnesota, the Omaha grain market was put upon its feet and at once became a live competitor with Chicago, Minneapolis,

St. Louis, Kansas City and numerous other lesser market points.

From the very start the Omaha market was a pronounced success. The Omaha Grain exchange was established with fifty firms, companies and individuals taking memberships. The constitution and by-laws of the organization provided for 200 memberships. Rooms were rented on the top floor of the
