NEBRASKA CITY, Neb., Nov. 2.—(Special Telegram.)—The fitness of Sam Kellogg, fullback and captain of the Nebraska City football team, was all that saved the local team from a 34 to 0 shutout from South High school team of Omaha on the local field this afternoon.

During the game South High registered 29 yards and lost down but three times. Nebraska City carried the ball for only 16 yards, being unable to penetrate the stone wall of the Omaha line.
