City Hall Man Tries to Tell the Man Who First Shot Ducks and Loses.

### SHOT WITH SILVER BULLET

Once upon a time a bold hunter went forth to hunt wild fowl, whose habitat is along marshy lakes and where placid rivers flow. This night of the fowling piece had not been schooled in the art of stealing upon the wary water birds.

He fired many shots into the frosty ozone and the sounds of his weapon reverberated through the Iowa hills. Tired and heartick he trudged to a market place where insensate wild ducks were hanging from hooks. He bought two ducks, placed them in his game bag, hurried home and was greeted by expectant wife and children.

The news quickly spread through the neighborhood that the Browns were going to have wild duck for dinner and that Mr. Brown had been hunting.

This particular Mr. Brown is Rodman M. Brown, structural engineer in the city building department. He brought the heads of ducks down to the office and was showing the evidences of the hunt to his associates when Lee Bridges, building inspector and old-time hunter, picked up the heads and made an examination.

Mr. Bridges testified that the eyes of the head of the male duck were dried to almost nothing, indicating that the duck had met its demise not less than ten days ago; also an incision in the neck suggested the effect of the hanging process at a market. The other head yielded similar evidence, whereupon Mr. Brown entered a plea of guilty.

## Detectives at Sea Over Theft of Mrs. Hamilton's Jewels

The Union Pacific secret service department is completely at sea over the reported robbery of Mrs. Jane McClure Hamilton, Sunday, while she was a passenger on train No. 67, between Cheyenne and Green River. Company detectives here from Cheyenne, Ogden and elsewhere along the line have worked on the case since it was first reported and have been unable to find any clue to the whereabouts of the missing jewelry and plate, which, according to Mrs. Hamilton was worth \$1,500.

It is asserted that Mrs. Hamilton, who is now on her way west from Ogden, reiterates her first story that the valuables were all in a large case and that when out some distance west of Cheyenne, she left the case on one of the seats in her section in the sleeper. She went to the dressing room, remaining there something like half an hour and when she returned to the body of the car, the case and the contents had disappeared.

Since the case was reported to the Union Pacific officials, all employees of the car in which Mrs. Hamilton was a passenger have been closely questioned

and none of them remember having seen the case on the seat, as she contends it was. Inquiry has been made of a number of the passengers on the car. They all remember seeing Mrs. Hamilton, but none of them remember having seen the jewel case that she describes.

## Messenger Boy Stops a Bad Blaze

Fire, discovered by a messenger boy, was quickly extinguished early yesterday at the building occupied by the Sutherland Machinery company at 1914 Douglas street.

The blaze started in the elevator shaft and the damage was estimated at \$200. The cause of the fire is unknown, but will be investigated by the fire warden.
