Approaching Holiday Offers Excuse Or Reason for Another Dull Season.

NEW YO, RK, Nov, M.-The approach-ing holiday affords an excuse if not an actual reason for another duil seadon of the stock exchange although trading was well in excesses of yesterday's small output. With a few exceptions prices were substantially better, several new maximums being scored by high priced specialties. All the oil shares were strong, Texas company leading with an advance of 30% to the new record of 239, Cuban-American sugars advance of 3% to 150 established a new high price for the stock, while south Porto Rice sugar rose to 15%. War insome were not materially af-fected by the intimation that the allies might censo further purchases of muni-tions in this market. Some of the stocks advanced to 3% points, the greatest gain beine made by Crucible steel preferred as a result of renewal of divisions. Ralls were irregular during the early session, chiefly because of the parsistent pressive against New Haven, which fell by to 15%, but later pronounced improve-ment was manifested, the rise conciding with the publication of southern Pacific a increase in earnings for October of almost \$1,20,40. are in earnings for October of almost
