

INVESTMENT SHARES HEAVY

NEW YORK, Nov. 1.—There was little in today's dull and dragging market to warrant specific comment. Investment tooks were moderately heavy, while some of the more volatile specialties supplemented recent gains, only to lose them in part or whole, before the close. Interest in war shares showed steady diminution and even ventursome speculators seemed to realize the futility of an artificial or forced movement in those chares at this time. Manipulation was responsible for a few new records in closely held issues. South Porto Rich Sugar rose 8 points to 14 and Chulan-American Sugar gained 4 at 177, but both tell sharply before the close. United States Industrial Alcohol at the new maximum of 12% on its 43-point rise and Montana Power with its record price of 12% met the same fate.

Temporary gains of 3 to 8 points were shown in the early dealings by such widely divergent issues as Studetaker. Scare-Roebuck, Texas company. New York Air Brake and American Cool Products, with more moderate advances for cratwhile favorites like Crucible Steel. Lackawanna Steel and Baldwin Locomtive.

American Locomotive was heavy on rumors of legal action against the management and American Can preferred reflected disappointment at the failure of the directors to reduce accrued dividends, while Mercantile Marine preferred lost 5% points at 63%.

Ralls larged within very narrow limitation Pennsylvania making but feeble response to its remarkable October carnings. Dealings in this class of securities were the lightest of any day for several weeks.
