

PRICES QUOTED FOR XMAS DINNER

Ducks, Geese and Turkeys Are to Be Plentiful and to Cost Some Less.

OTHER PRICES FLUCTUATE

Ducks, geese and turkeys will be on the market to tempt the buyers as Christmas day approaches, and prospects of a smoking Christmas dinner loom bright.

Turkeys will be quoted around 25 cents a pound. Geese will sell at about 17 1/2 cents. Ducks have good prospects of selling at 20 cents a pound. Chickens are still 15 cents a pound.

Cranberries are 8 1/2 cents a pound, and oysters, nice for dressing, are worth 30 cents a quart.

Fancy bacon is hard to get at this time, as it is reported the hogs coming on the market at this time are the poorer grade, with little fat on them.

Mince-meat Without Meat. For those who like their mince pies for Christmas, fancy mince meat without real meat is in vogue in a short time, is on the market at 15 cents. More and more the people are demanding mince meat without meat at all, and made from pure fruits, so that it will keep better.

Beef and pork have remained practically steady with the prices of last week. Pork chops are 15 1/2 cents, round steak 17 1/2, sirloin 22, porterhouse 27, and shoulder steaks 15 1/2 cents. Pot roasts can be had at 15 1/2 cents also.

Potatoes are up and are selling at 20 cents a peck, or 80 cents a bushel. Flour has taken a considerable advance in the wholesale market and millers are quoting prices only for a day or two—four hours at a time, as they look for further advances.

Hayden Bros., with a good supply of flour on hand, are still selling flour at \$1.35 a sack, but there is no telling when this will have to be changed.

Sugar May Go Up. Sugar has made advances also. This may also still be had seventeen pounds

for it, but may be raised at any time to meet the increase in the wholesale market. Naval oranges are coming in in large quantities and excellent quality. They are quoted at 40 cents a dozen. Nice grapefruits are on the market, quoted, depending upon size, at 35, 5, 6 1/2 and 7 1/2 cents. Empire grapes are going at 12 1/2 cents. They come in especially fine bunches and of good quality. Fancy Jonathan apples are selling at 35 cents a peck. Casaba melons are on the market at 25 cents each.

Nuts Cost More. Fresh this year's nuts for Christmas are somewhat higher than usual. Most classes of nuts are quoted at 17 1/2 cents a pound, with the exception of hickory-nuts, quoted at 5 cents, and black walnuts at 3 1/2 cents. Ready mixed nuts, consisting of hazelnuts, English walnuts, hickory-nuts, pecans, Brazil nuts and almonds are selling at 37 1/2 cents a pound. Butter has gone to 33 cents a pound. As a consequence a demand has been created for butterine.

On account of the exceptionally fine weather running so late this fall, hens have begun to lay, and fresh eggs are finding their way to market. This threatens to cut down the demand for storage eggs. Storage eggs are selling at 25 cents, while fresh eggs are going at 35 cents.

Two Big Elevators Filled With Wheat Burned at Erie, Pa.

ERIE, Pa., Dec. 10.—Two of the three Anchor line grain elevators owned by the Pennsylvania Railroad company here were destroyed by fire early today, with their contents, about 500,000 bushels of wheat. The loss is estimated at \$750,000. A third elevator, holding 225,000 bushels of wheat, was saved by firemen. The wheat came from Canada and awaited shipment to Great Britain and its allies.

An investigation of the origin of the fire will be requested. No other cause than spontaneous combustion has been yet assigned.

Will Try Hauser After Holidays to Avoid Xmas Jury

County Attorney Magney will not put Arthur Hauser, accused of the murder of W. H. Smith, Woodmen of the World cashier, on trial until after Christmas, he said Friday, because there is too much of the spirit of "Peace on earth and good will toward men" in the air during the holiday season. "Hauser will be tried after the holidays," said the county attorney. "Juries just before Christmas are inclined to be lenient and inclined toward acts of sympathy. Hauser's escape from the punishment which is due him would be a very poor Christmas present, in my opinion." Hauser probably will be tried early in January, Mr. Magney said.

WITHNELL TO ASK BIDS FOR HOSE AND AUTOS

City Commissioner Withnell announces that the first of the new year he will advertise for bids for 10,000 feet of hose and a lot of motor apparatus for the fire department. Some of the hose will be installed in South Side fire houses. Mr. Withnell intends to motorize the houses at Fortieth and Hamilton streets, Twenty-second and Ames avenue, Twentieth and Spring streets and Thirty-seventh and Jackson streets.

The cost of this new equipment will approximate \$65,000, which will be the amount of the special 3-mill levy included in the 1916 general levy and authorized by the last legislature. This special levy will be assessed for five years. Mr. Withnell does not propose to urge the city commission to adopt his scheme for a new standard fire alarm system. Instead he will use the \$65,000 as outlined.
