Eighty-Nine Cars of Wheat Reported In, with Prices Unchanged to One Cent Lower.

CORN SELLS ONE CENT HIGHER. OMAHA, January 15, 1916. The wheat market was very steady today and the receipts were very good. Eighty-nine cars were reported in and wheat sold unchanged to one cent lower. Over 100 cars of corn were received on the local exchange today and the best grades sold higher, while the poorer corn sold off.

Cats were very steady, selling unchanged to one cent lower. Rye and barley were unchanged. Clearances, wheat and flour equal to 47.00 bu.; corn, 12.00 bu.; oats, 23.00 bu.

Liverpool closed with wheat 1/8 cent lower, and corn unchanged. Primary wheat receipts were 97,000 bu. and shipments of 81,000 bu., against receipts of 82,000 bu. and shipments of 1,17,000 bu. last year.
