OMAHA FIVES ARE LEADERS IN STATE

Thirty-Five High School Games Played Last Week Show Local Quintets Have the Class.

COLUMBUS SPRINGS SURPRISE

The last week has seen the most active in state basketball activities since the opening of the season a short month back.

The biggest surprise of the week came with the defeat of the fast Geneva team by Lincoln, by a score of 14 to 8, at Lincoln Saturday night.

Two dark horses were uncovered among other no less exciting events. Columbus, with practically no history or record at all, defeated the fast Fremont quintet by a score of 21 to 18 in midweek.

Crete Wins Again. Crete disposed of Fairmont, a strong five in Fillmore county that boasted of a clean record for many weeks.

Grand Island continued its downward slide and was defeated twice during the last week, first by Osceola by a score of 25 to 25, and later by Central City by a score of 45 to 27.

Heatrice, after a second attempt, failed to pile up a score on the University Place five, only scoring a four-point margin at the close of the game with that team on their own floor Friday night.

South High unseated its sixth straight victory Friday night by defeating Commerce High by a score of 31 to 12.

Central High defeated Sioux City, easy victory over Norfolk, in a slow game Saturday night by a score of 24 to 16.

Omaha Fives Lead. It now appears that the two Omaha fives are undisputed leaders in the state field.

Lincoln, Central High has its final test when it meets the Capital City for a return game on a Lincoln floor some weeks hence.

South High will be tested Friday evening when the team meets Heatrice, if victories are forthcoming in both games, there will be no dispute as to the leadership of the local fives, and their race for the state championship will be a pretty one.

Lincoln, Beatrice, Central City, Crete, Geneva, Hebron, Columbus and Fremont seem runners-up in the competition, according to the present dope.

On Friday night this week Peters will wrestle Fred Schumarder of Louisville, Neb., at Papillion. Schumarder is another Nebraska wrestler who has been cutting quite a swath of recent years.

The Louisville boys believe he is a coming champ and confidently predict a victory over Peters. Peters, however, ranks an easy favorite despite the confidence of the Louisville fans.

On February 19 Peters will wrestle Carl Eklund at the Omaha Auditorium. This match was consummated yesterday by Pete Page, manager of Eklund, and Pete Loeb, business manager for Peters.

Eklund is a light heavyweight wrestler, who has appeared throughout Nebraska and Iowa for the last year, but has never wrestled in Omaha. He is a foxy and clever wrestler and is figured to give Peters a good run.

Eklund boasts a victory over Tony Stecher, brother of the famous Joe, and many other stars.

Peters has several other matches on the card, including one at Beatrice, March 5.

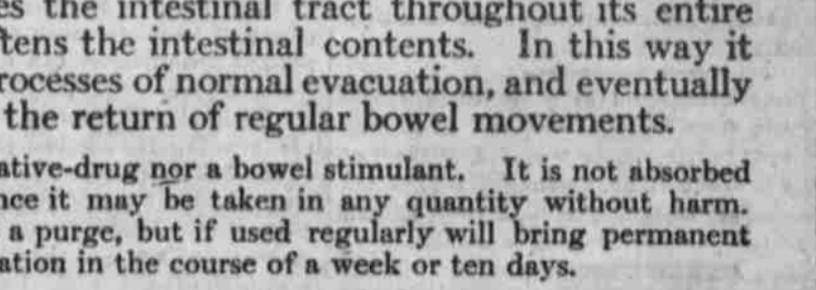
