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Disquieting crop reports from the domestic winter wheat belt acted as a further handicap on the bears. According to well known authority, the recent violent changes in temperature had caused alternate thawing and freezing in numerous sections, and had not unlikely brought about considerable damage to unprotected fields. On the other hand, enlarged receipts northwest exerted only transient influence against the bulls.

Coarse grains were firmer. Foreigners were taking both corn and oats, but mainly corn. The effect of good weather and of relatively large receipts of corn was thus more than offset.
