MAYOR THOMPSON CLAIMS VICTORY

Opposition Disputes This and Points to the Renomination of Seven "Rebels."

SULLIVAN'S FACTION WINS OUT

CHICAGO, March 1 .- Both administration and anti-administration men claimed victory today after analysing the vote at the aldermanic pripointed to a total of twenty-seven republican aldermanic nominations supported by him as evidence of victory, and the anti-administration forces based their claim of success on the fact that seven of the "rebel nine" aldermen, as Thompson's principal antagonists were styled, had been nominated

Mayor Thompson lost his home ward, the Twenty-third, by 2,500. Both republican factions declared their determination today to contipue the fight.

Vote is Very Light. The vote cast was lighter than expected. Leaders yesterday expressed the opinion that the fight in a number of wards would result in a vote of nearly 400,000, but returns show that not more than 275,000 persons voted. On the democratic side a victory was recorded for the Roger C. Sullivan forces over the Har-Roger C. Sullivan forces over the Harrison-Dunne faction, the former carrying twenty-seven of the thirty-five wards.

lighter than was looked for and amounted to but 32.3 per cent of the total female registration. The male vote was 28 per cent of registration. Yesterday's primary female vote, as compared with that cast in the 1915 primary Was: 1915, 189,686; 1916, 81,131. The socialist party neminated candi-

dates in all but three wards. This was done merely to comply with the law, as the party nominations had already been made by the regular party referendum. The progressive party nominated candidates in only two wards.

Mayor's Fight on West. Unusual interest attached to the struggle by reason of the mayor's ambition to succeed Roy O. West as republican national committeeman, and curiosity as to what effect on the vote the enforcement of the Sunday closing law against saloons by the mayor would have.

Mayor Thompson in campaign speeches asserted that the fight against him in the nine leading 'revolutionary' wards was due to the activities of former Governor Charles S. Dencen, who always has supported Mr. West for re-election as national committeeman.

In the First ward, which includes the downtown district, the republican contest produced a woman candidate, Hilda Johnson Haskins. Of the female vote she received 36, against 107 for William H. GERMAN OFFICERS

Plans of American Forts Found on Two Men Arrested on Charge of Misuse of Mails.

SENT OUT BEGGING LETTERS

NEW YORK, March 1 .- Plans of United States fortifications have been found in the possession of Fichard Von Arend and Rudolph Von Kracht, two young Germans, arrested here on a charge of using the mails to swindle, according to a statement made today by Assistant United States District Attorney E. W. McDonald.

Von Arend and Von Kracht, who claim, according to the federal authorities, to be German lieutenants, were arraigned before a United States commissioner here.

According to postoffice inspectors, the two men had conducted a systematic begging campaign through the mails asking for help on the ground that they were destitute German army officers. They are said to have refused the aid of representatives of charity organizations because they did not wish to make public their ontecedents as required by such organizations.

Von Arend and von Kracht were held in \$5,000 ball each for a hearing Saturday. They denied ever having had any plans of American forts and said the only things answering such a description that they owned were pictures sent them from Germany by relatives.
