Dinners of Last Week. Mr. and Mrs. Frank Judson gave the largest dinner of the week, preceding the subscription club's dance, Thursday evening.

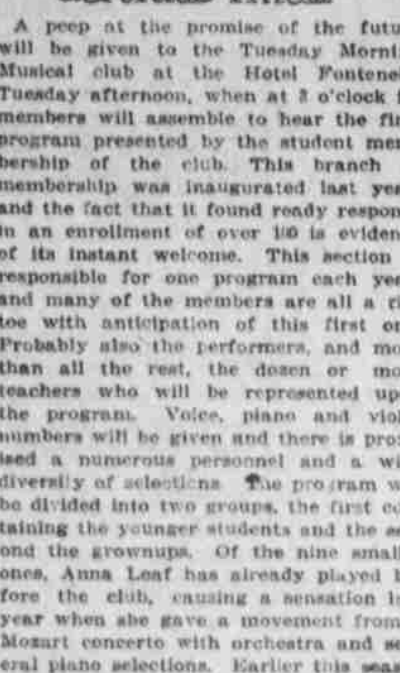

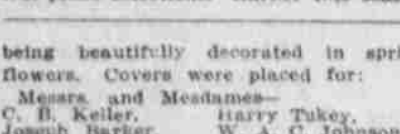

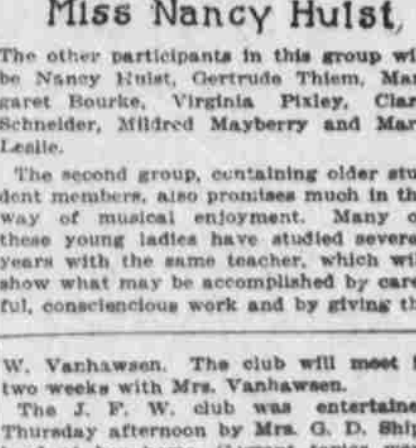
