## EMBARGO ON EXPORT WHEAT AT GALVESTON RAISED

Telegram has reached the Omaha Grain exchange that the embargo on wheat shipments into Galveston has been lifted and that the elevators there are

in a position to handle a considerable quantity of grain. This, however, did not give the market an upturn and wheat sold off 1 to 2 cents, the prices ranging from 87 1/2 cents to \$1.04 1/2 per bushel. Receipts for the day were 53 carloads, considered fairly heavy for a Saturday. Corn was up a cent, the best selling at 6 1/2 cents per bushel, with the off grades selling down to 4. There were 30 carloads on the market. Oats gained 1/2 cent per bushel and sold 1 3/4 and 4 1/2 cents per bushel. Receipts were 11 carloads.
