of Maude Adams, died here at 10 o'clock last night. Maude Adams, who cancelled her New York theatrical engagements in order to be at the bedside of her dying mother, was with her. Maude Adams concluded abruptly her New York engagement last Saturday night and left for Salt Lake immediately.

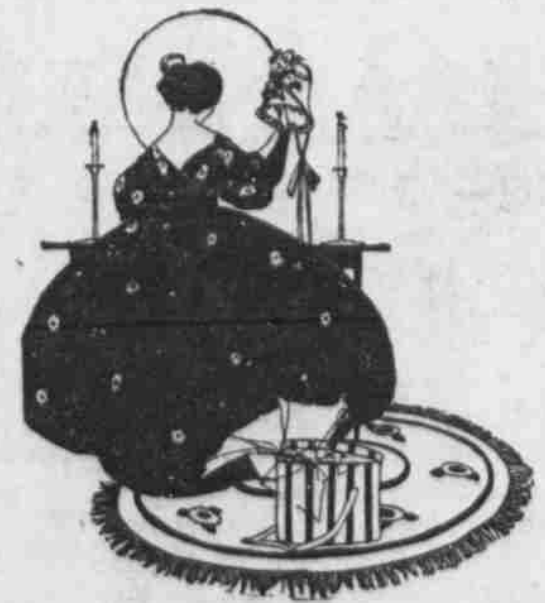
