The widow of Joseph Smith firmly refoxed to follow Young west, or to recognixe his usurped authority, and stayed in her home on the banks of the Mississippl, with her four young sons, and reared them to be God-fearing and lawabiding citizens. When Joseph, the oldest of these sons, reached his majority. he made two great resolutions. One was that he would live in such a manner that no one, from his actions, should be father had been a bad man. At the approaching conference some interest will center around the choosing of a new presiding bishop of the church. to take the place of E. L. Kelley, whose resignation was accepted at the conference. It is thought to place some young man in this position, whose experience in business shall qualify him for taking charge of the rapidly enlarging financial affairs of the church. 
