### FRENCH CURTAIN OF FIRE CHECKS INFANTRY RUSH

Efforts of Crown Prince to Follow  
Up Successes Earlier in Day at  
Vaux Reported to Have  
Failed.

### CHARGE OF FOOT SOLDIERS

Galic Positions Between Avocourt  
and Malancourt Subjected to  
Bombardment.

### STATEMENT BY PARIS OFFICE

PARIS, April 2.—The Germans  
launched heavy attacks again today  
against the French positions both to  
the west and east of the Meuse. To  
the west the attacks were repulsed,  
but to the east, in the neighborhood  
of Fort Douaumont, the assaulting  
forces were able to penetrate the  
Callote wood, lying to the south.  
From the northern part of the wood  
they were almost immediately ejected  
by French counter attacks.

PARIS, April 2.—There was no  
event of importance last night on the  
entire French battle front, says the  
official announcement issued this afternoon.  
On the west bank of the Meuse, north of Verdun, the Germans  
violently bombarded French  
positions in Avocourt wood, but there  
was no infantry attack.

BERLIN, April 2.—The German  
official statement issued today an-  
nounces that Tenthon troops have  
cleared 5,000 yards of French  
trenches northeast of Hancourt in ad-  
dition to the positions taken March  
30. The only mention of fighting  
around Verdun yesterday tells of the  
repulse of a French counter attack  
after a terrific artillery bombardment  
which was repulsed.

An attempt by the Germans to fol-  
low up their success in obtaining a  
foothold in the village of Vaux by  
an infantry attack between Vaux  
and Fort Douaumont has failed.

Preparation for an attack was  
made by a violent artillery bombardment.  
The French curtain of fire  
stopped the infantry assault, Paris  
says.

French positions between Avocourt  
and Malancourt continue to be  
subjected to intense bombardment  
from German guns.

The German previous successful at-  
tempt to penetrate the French lines was  
prevented, according to Paris, by an as-  
sault that was checked by the French  
curtain of fire and the infantry, and  
there were spirited engagements at close  
quarters before the crown prince's forces  
finally succeeded in pressing part way  
into the village.

### Dairy Farmers Run Milk Into Ditches Till They Get Price

CHICAGO, April 2.—The dairy farmers  
made good their threat today to dump  
all their milk into the ditches rather than  
sell it at the depressed market price. In  
some instances they refused to  
sell the milk at the market price, but  
in some cases they dumped it into the  
ditches. The market price for milk  
was 16 cents a gallon today, and it was  
said that some farmers have dumped 2,000  
gallons of milk into the ditches today.
