NEW MEXICAN VIEW OF PARRAL AFFAIR

Report to Carranza Says American Colonel Admitted Blame for Fighting in City.

HARMONY AGAIN RESTORED

MEXICO CITY, April 16.—The war office received a dispatch tonight in which further details are given of the Parral affair. It was asserted an American officer admitted his culpability for entering the town.

The dispatch also says American troops have ceased their movement southward until such time as the negotiations between the United States and Mexican governments are terminated.

The full text of the dispatch follows: "General Ismael Lozano, accompanied by General Garcia and Hernandez, but an end to the trouble at Parral and persuaded the American troops to retire to the outskirts of that city, where they were followed by the hostile populace."

At this point the American colonel in charge of the Parral regiment asked for a conference, which was held at the village of Santa Cruz Villages between the American colonel and the municipal president. The American army officer admitted he had entered the city without permission, but claimed he had sent an orderly from the town of Zaragoza, requesting permission to enter, and that, receiving no answer and the orderly not returning, he went to investigate.

"The American officer expressed regret at what had happened and the American troops and the constitutionalists are working in complete harmony."

Addresses of welcome by President Wilson and Mrs. William Cumming Story of New York, president general, were the outstanding events on today's program. Other speakers included John Hays Hammond, Newell B. Woodworth, president general of the National Society of Sons of the American Revolution, and W. B. Adams, president of the New Jersey Society of Sons of the American Revolution.

There will be a discussion of national preparedness Wednesday evening by Hudson Maxim and other noted authorities. The "spirit of patriotism" imperated by Miss Katharine Eglington, will ask questions on preparedness and motion pictures on "America Unprepared" will be presented.

Ten vice president generals and one honorary vice president general are to be elected tomorrow.

The delegates will attend a reception by President and Mrs. Wilson Thursday afternoon at the White House.
