

GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Wheat Sales Show Weak Trend, Some of Them Falling Off Two Cents. DEMAND FOR CORN IS GOOD

OMAHA, April 19, 1916. The wheat market was very weak today, most of the sales being made at 10c lower, although a few showed a 2c drop under yesterday's prices.

The demand for corn was good, the market being quoted 1c lower to 1 1/2c higher. The bulk of sales were made at the lower price, while a few sold higher.

The receipts of oats continue light, the market as a rule being 1c lower. Clearances were: Wheat and flour equal to 10,000 bushels; corn, 4,000 bushels; Liverpool clover, 100 bushels; and other crops, 100 bushels.

Primary wheat receipts were 1,020,000 bushels and shipments, 82,000 bushels, against receipts of 42,000 bushels and shipments of 2,880,000 bushels last year.

Primary corn receipts were 107,000 bushels and shipments, 424,000 bushels, against receipts of 473,000 bushels and shipments of 612,000 bushels last year.

Primary soybean receipts were 1,000,000 bushels and shipments, 1,000,000 bushels, against receipts of 361,000 bushels and shipments of 1,720,000 bushels last year.
