Explanation of the Shakespeare Puzzle

THIS exhibit on this page constitutes the awards to the winners of The Bee's Shakespeare Tercentenary Prize Puzzle, and we want to thank nearly 1,000 of our readers who have made it such a wonderful success. Never before have we had a contest covering so short a period, which has drawn such great interest. Our greatest regret is that we have but five prizes to distribute, according to our offer, yet at the same time those who worked on the puzzle are not unrewarded, for many have told us in their letters how pleasant and instructive they have found it, and we only wish we had prizes for all of them.

As an interesting side light, we may quote from one letter received: "My copy of Shakespeare is one issued by The Bee as a prize more than thirty years ago, and I hope to be among the winners again."

Most of the answers were neatly composed, and two of them so handsomely put up with specially artistic cover designs that we are going to give them each an extra prize in the way of a book for attractive form, notwithstanding the fact that neither is entitled to an award by the length of the list.

In explanation of the Puzzle, we may say that the number of Shakespeare characters properly included is 94, the correct list being herewith given. This excludes mere descriptive words, such as "forester," "lord" or "gaoler," and admits only accepted spellings of the names. All of the prize winners submitted more than the 94 names which were reduced by this elimination, that is to say, none had the exact 94 and no more, and even the first prize winner is cut down to 93 because of separating the name "Anne Page" to make two characters of it, "Anne" and "Page." Few of the contestants, furthermore, noted the fact that one character, "Lear," may be spelled out in two different parts of the list.

To despite the special pains taken to tell exactly what the "king's move" in chess is, as the essence of the method of spelling out the names, several seem to have acquired the

notion that they could pick out the letters by a hop, skip and jump, with marvelous results in lengthening the list of characters named, but obviously putting them out of the contest.

Fortunately no question presented as to which of two equally good solutions was entitled to have precedence in point of time. Dozens of answers, however, were dispatched "Special delivery" to insure prompt receipt, and quite a few by registered mail to make certain of acknowledgment.

To those who feel disappointed, we can only say that we may have another contest some time before long that will afford them an opportunity to try again and do better to their own and our gratification.
